#### LEAVE OF ABSENCE/HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

Having a good education helps to open up more opportunities in adult life for our children. As parents you have a legal duty to ensure that your children attend school on a regular basis.

The Principal may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

If you intend to take your child out of school **please complete a notification of absence form well in advance of any planned absence.** If the request is denied and you still decide to take your child out of school for a leave of absence then the absence will be coded as unauthorised. This may lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued.

Some parents/carers will find these measures severe but we believe that regular and high attendance is in every pupil's best interests and helps to maximise their achievements and enjoyment of school. Evidence shows that children with poor attendance are unlikely to succeed academically. All schools have a statutory obligation to provide information to the local Authority regarding attendance.

#### Contents of the course:

**Week 1**: Initial assessment/what is resilience?/situations requiring resilience/reaction of brain under stress(fight or flight)/modelling resilience to our families/mindfulness.

**Week 2:** Recapping, then the difference between self-confidence and self-esteem/components of self-esteem (Who am I? Where do I belong? How can I change what's happening to me?)

**Week 3:** Recapping, then self-esteem continued/circles of control (what can be changed and what can't)/how our language can promote self-esteem/making a gifts and qualities box to promote self-esteem.

Week 4: Recapping, then healthy body/mind—link between physical health and mental health, looking at food/exercise.


Week 5: Recapping/coping strategies/making a mantra canvas to promote resilience.

#### SAFETY UPDATE

#### Safety reminders for drop off and pick up times:

#### **Bikes and scooters**

Children must dismount from bikes and scooters when on school grounds, which is as soon as they leave Finedon Road or Leys Road.

- Cyclists should be wearing a cycle helmet
- Bikes and scooters should be securely locked if they are remaining on school property
- Motorised scooters, Segways and hover boards must not be brought to school.

Please use the pathways and crossings when you come on to the school site. <u>Do not</u> cut across the roads - there are so many vehicles about at this time, it is extremely dangerous to do so!

#### TRIM TRAIL

The trim trail in the playground is not suitable for preschool children to use. Please do not allow younger siblings to climb on the equipment at the beginning and end of school.

Also, please be aware that children from the school must not use the trim trail without supervision by a member of staff.

An urgent reminder to families that cars, including taxis, **must not come through the barrier onto the school site** when bringing in and collecting children each day, unless in exceptional circumstances, by prior arrangement with the office.

Please park sensibly and safely on the streets, remembering that families and some unaccompanied older children will be using the walkways.

Thank you to the families who correctly follow our safety procedures. Please remember:-

- It is an offence to park or wait on the zig-zag lines, even momentarily for dropping off or picking up a passenger.
- You must use the pedestrian crossings. The roads are so busy, especially at school drop off and collection times, it is so dangerous to try to dodge between the traffic.
