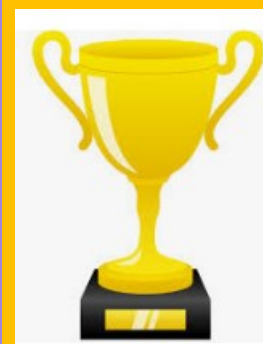

Medicines

You can be **fin**ed for taking your child on holiday during term time, or if your child has a number of **unauthorised** absences.

Schools have to inform the local authority of any pupils who are regularly absent from school, have irregular attendance, or have missed 5 school days or more without the school's permission.

Schools are also under a **safeguarding duty**, to investigate and report any unexplained absences. **This includes incidences where illness has been cited, but the school has reason to challenge this excuse for absence.**



There are 190 school days in a year and therefore 175 days of holidays and weekends. Please do not book holidays/family time during school term time – this will not be authorised and you could be fined.

Your child's welfare is very important to us.

Emergency Contact Information

It is vital that we have up to date information (home, work and mobile phone numbers) so that we can contact you, or someone else nominated by you, in an emergency. Normal first aid is available in school for minor accidents, but in cases of real emergency, **it is vital that we have a telephone contact number for every child.** Please try to give us at least 3 numbers.

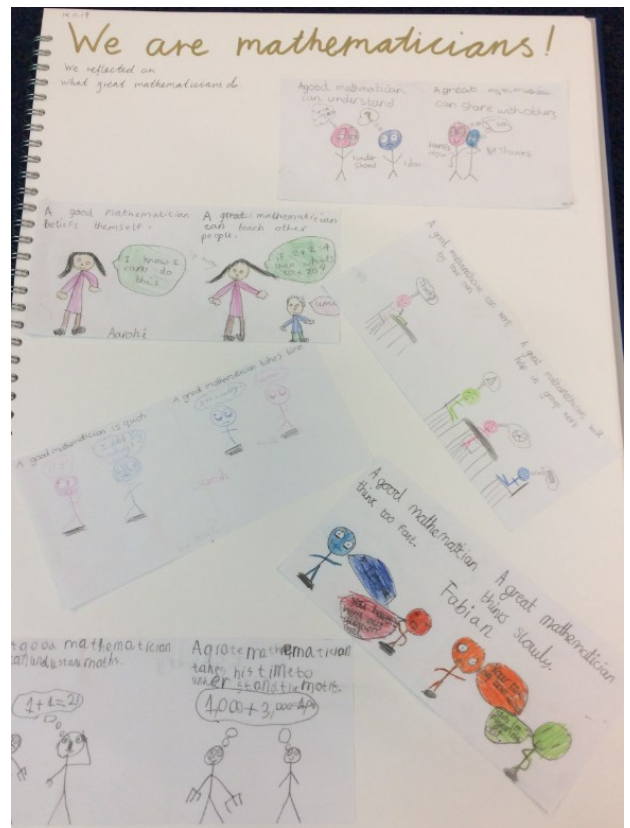
Class 3A enjoyed using a grid game to create a total.

4B enjoying Inspirational Maths



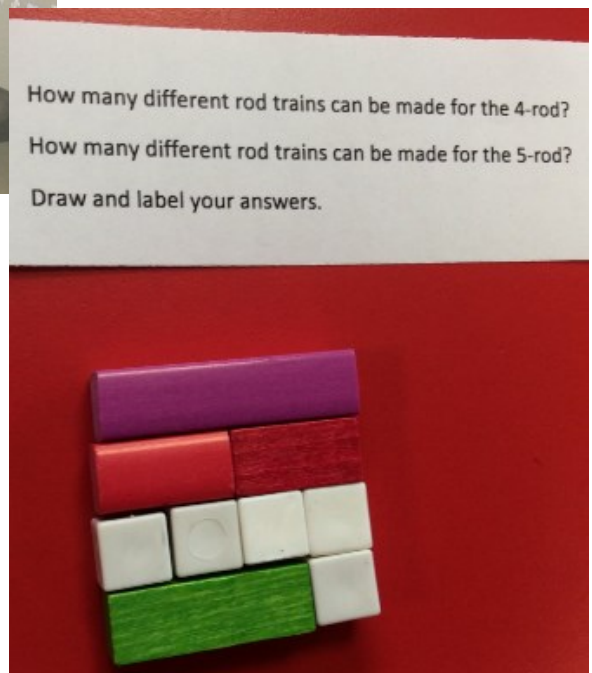
In class 4A we are thinking about how we are great at maths and what a great mathematician does.

Will we win \$100?

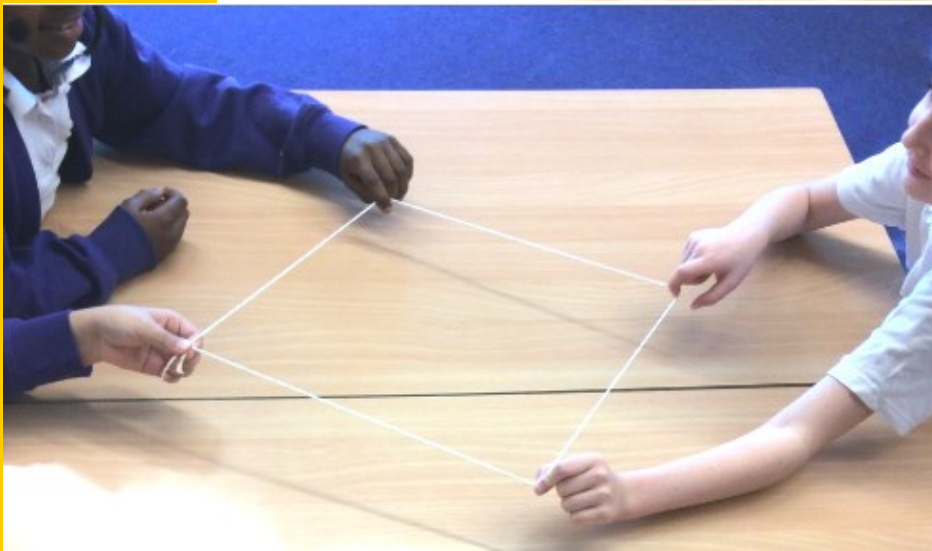
Year 3's week of inspirational maths is going well. We enjoyed used the rods to find different patterns.

We have been designing baby mobiles for Highfield nursery in Year 1. We are really proud of our work.



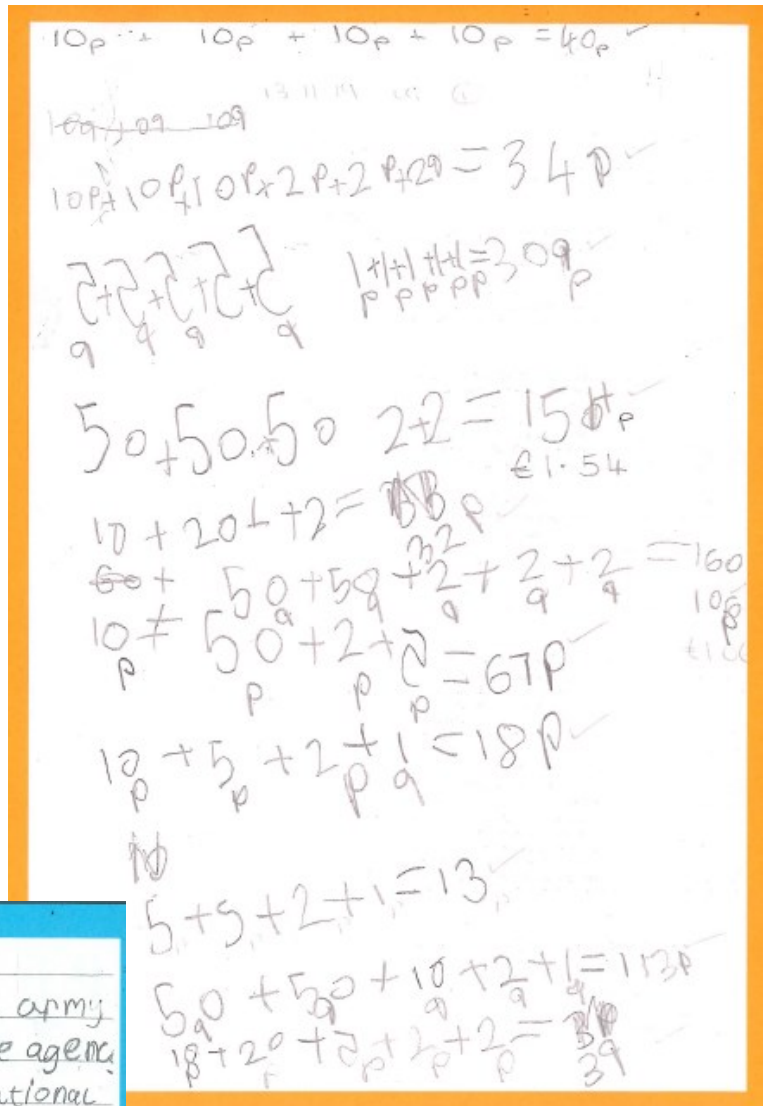
We drew around our bodies and labelled our body parts. We learnt new words such as wrist, knuckle and ankle.

You must book your appointment via ParentMail this year. If you have not booked yet, please do so as soon as possible. If you are having difficulties, please ask for help at the school office.

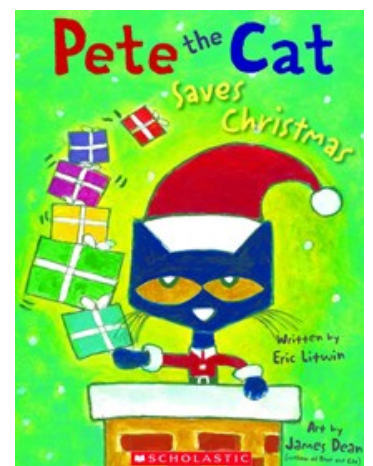
