Make every minute count

If your child is 5 minutes late every day, they will miss three days of learning each year.

If your child is 15 minutes late every day, they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year.

Have a set time to go to bed each night

Have a set time to get out of bed in the morning.

Have school uniform and bag ready the night before.

Your child's welfare is very important to us.

Emergency Contact Information

It is vital that we have up to date information (home, work and mobile phone numbers) so that we can contact you, or someone else nominated by you, in an emergency.

First aid is available in school for minor accidents, but in cases of real emergency, it is vital that we have a telephone contact number for every child. Please try to give us at least 3 numbers.

If your contact information has changed – telephone numbers or address – please complete the attached form and hand it in to the office.

At this time of year the children seem to suffer with various viruses, colds and sickness. If you feel your child is genuinely too poorly to attend school, please remember to ring in each day to tell us about their absence. This is a vital part of our safeguarding procedure and we very much appreciate your continued support with this.

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Equally important is that children arrive at school on time every day. Being on time is a great, positive start to the day, ready to make the most of the day's learning. Please allow plenty of time for your journey – if you are finding it hard to get your child to school on time, talk to the school office and ask for support.

Passport and Visa Applications.

Please be aware that if you need to apply for a passport from your country of origin for an adult or a child, the entire procedure can be completed at the relevant Embassy in London.

Absence will not be authorised for trips abroad for passport applications and the procedure of penalty notices will apply.








6B are reflecting shapes in the x and y axis today. Let's hope we have done this accurately.






We used our story map and the our own finger puppets to tell our story. Well done everyone!


