If you feel your child is genuinely too poorly to attend school, please remember to ring in each day to tell us about their absence. This is a vital part of our safeguarding procedure and we very much appreciate your continued support with this.


CLASSROOM NEWS

Year 2 have been working together making different shapes in dance.






