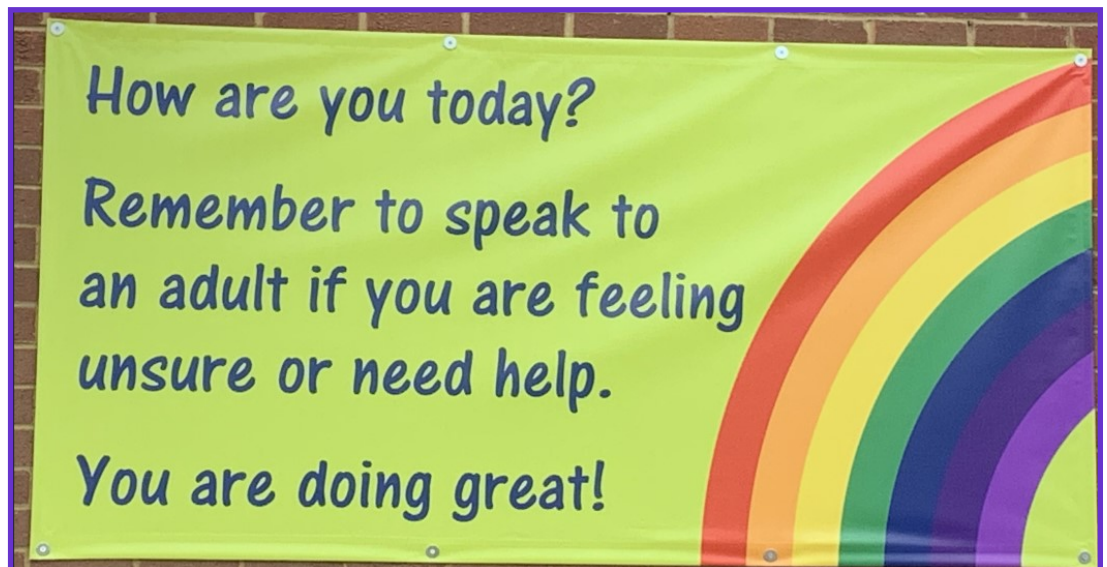

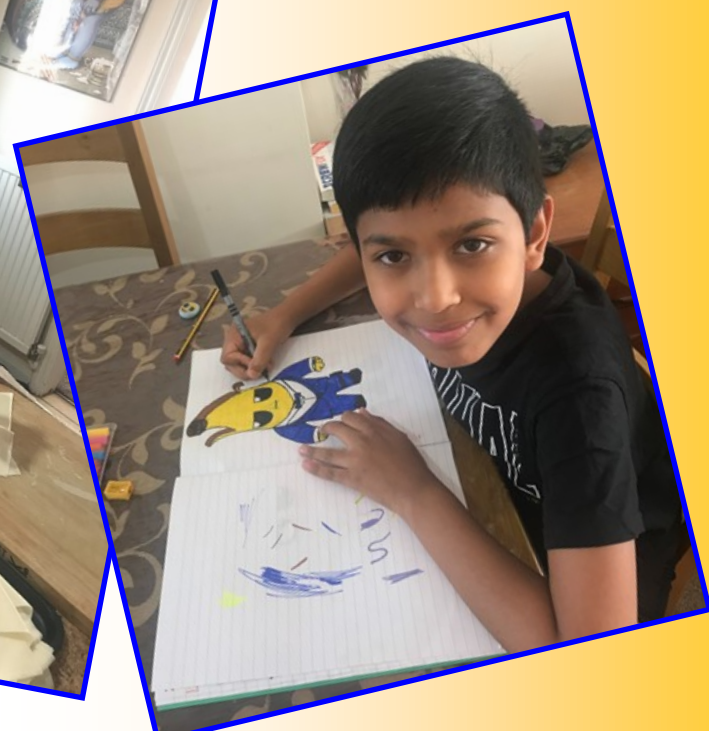

Lucy has joined in with a PTA Facebook challenge. Her rocket is going to the moon to see the stars and maybe an alien!



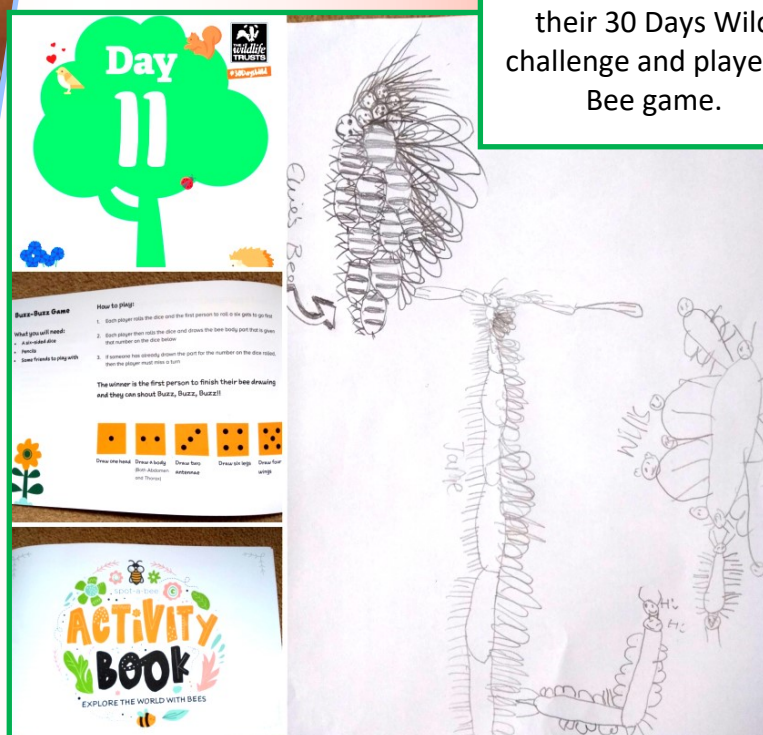
Connie has sent in some Superheroes. See the details on page 10.

New challenges will be set each day and we will be asking you to let school know how you have got on. There will be a mixture of things that can be completed using a small number of items or just your imagination!

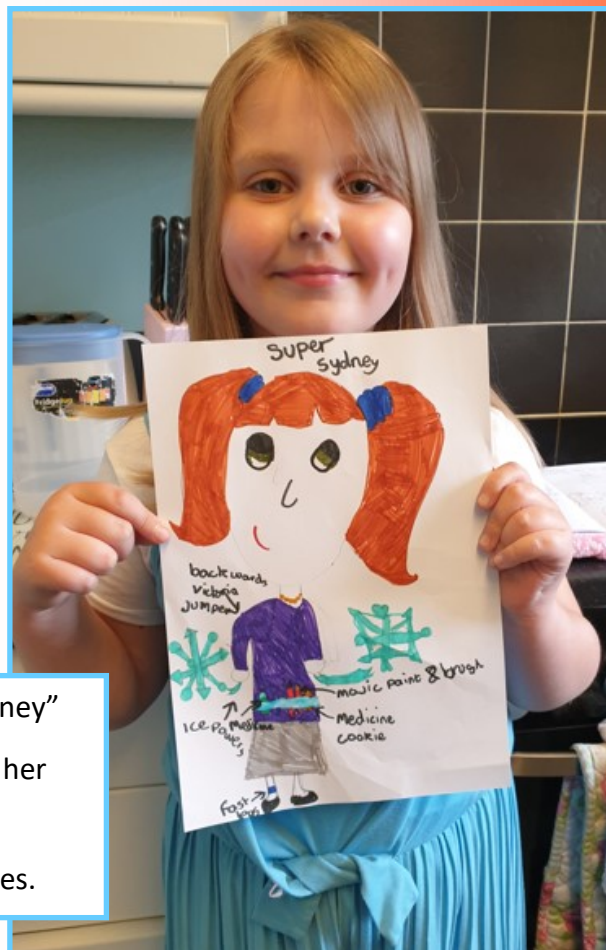
Have a go and let us know!

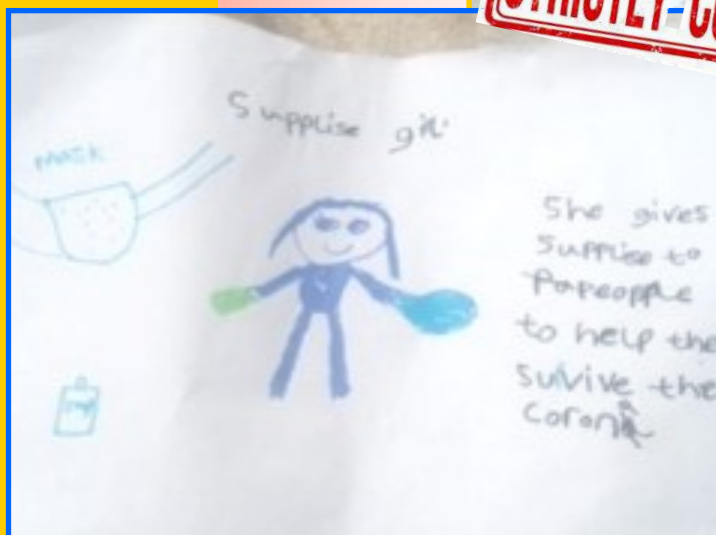
Introducing Peely and Leafy part of the fruit and veg men!

Their superpowers include night vision, a super memory, the ability to fight off germs and stronger bones.

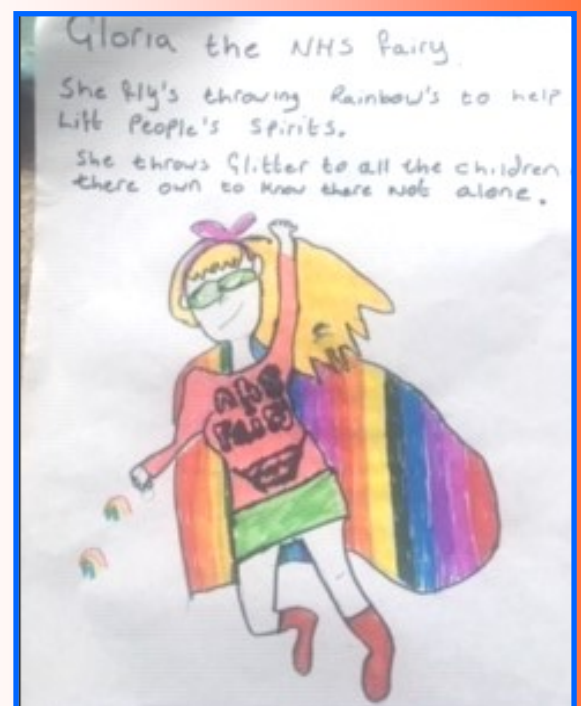
Gracie Cooper, Class 2B

My super power is to help people that are ill and sick, by touching them on their shoulder. Then they are better.



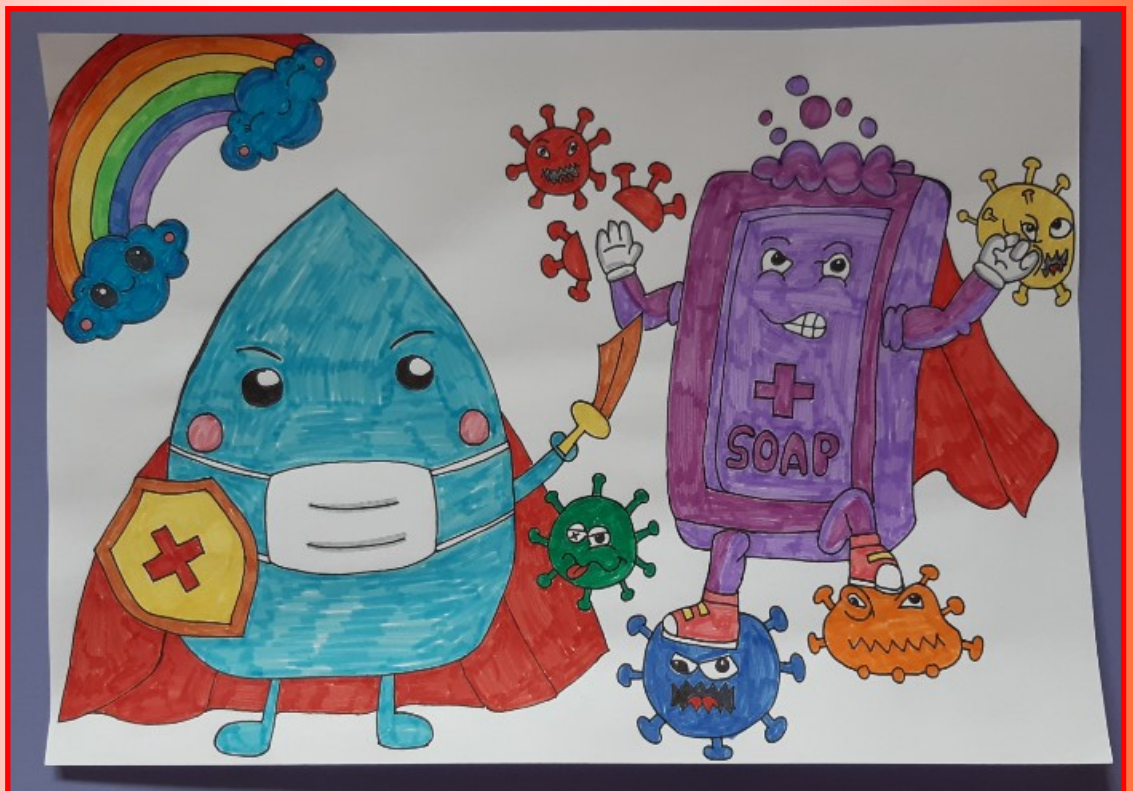
