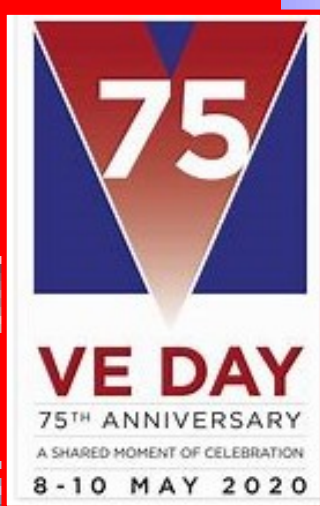

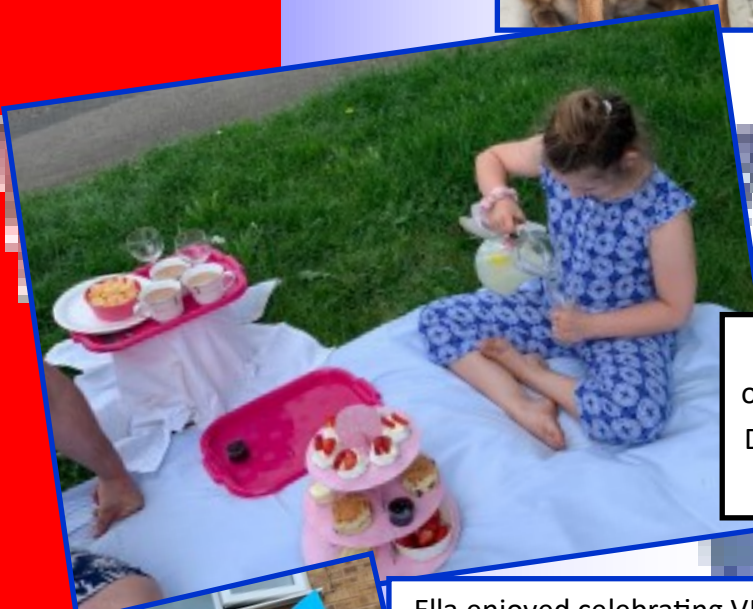

Gracie and Gabriel celebrating VE Day - the whole street celebrated from their driveways

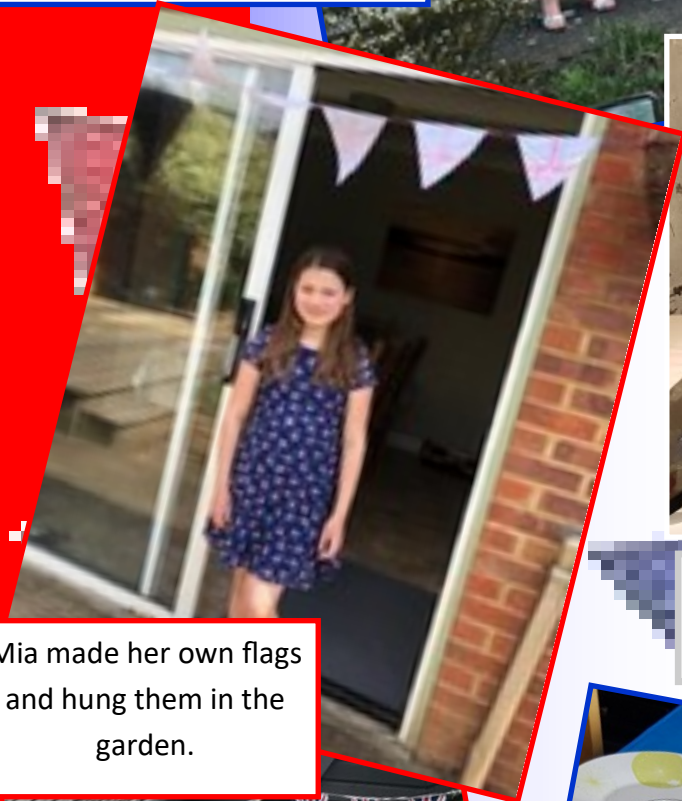
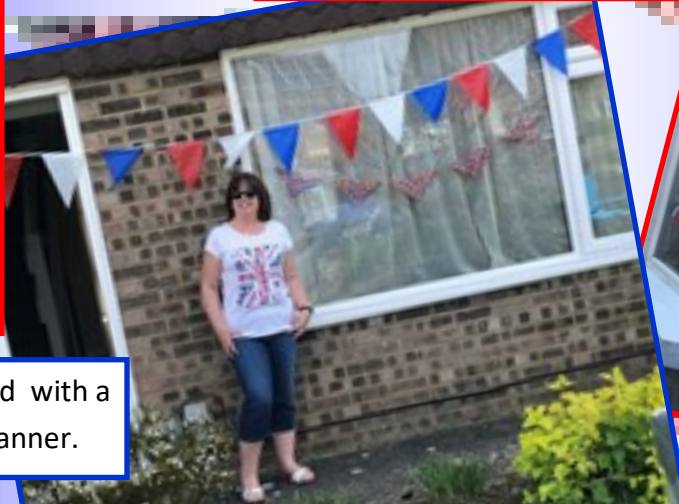




Mrs Little's family made this VE Day banner to decorate their house. It all looks very professional.

Fun fact - A crocodile cannot stick out its tongue.



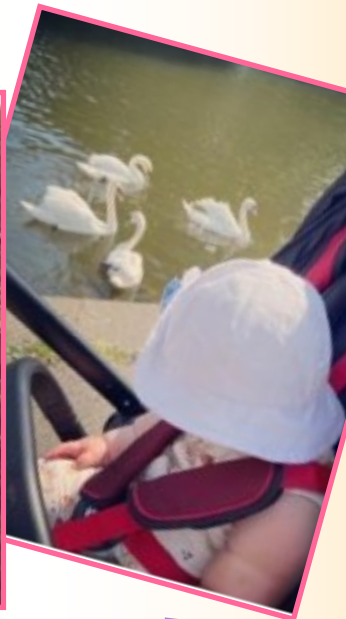
Did you know? Your forearm is the same length as your foot!

By popular demand, social distancing Badminton.

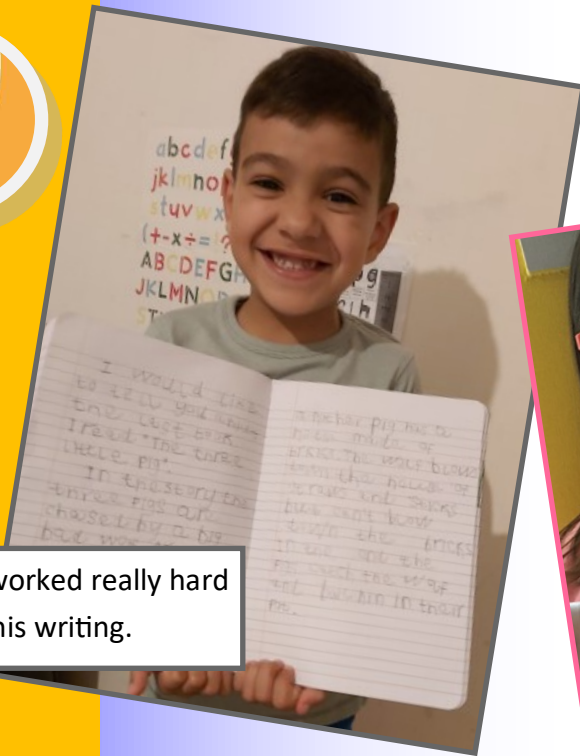

Gabriel made a K'NEX Dragon that turns around :)

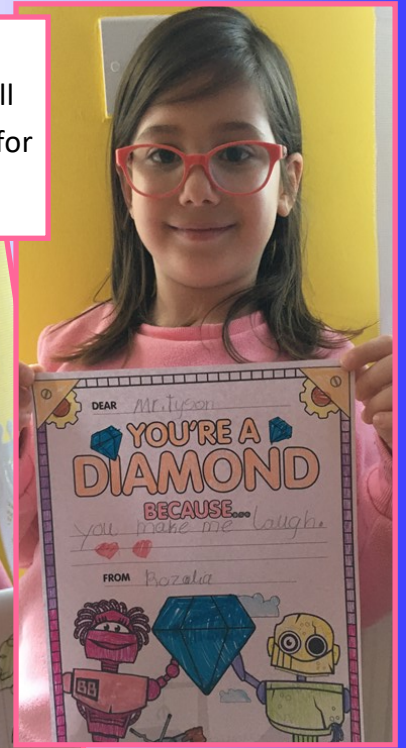


A message from Charlie and Jack.
"Hello everyone, miss you all lots, hope to see you soon, keep safe."

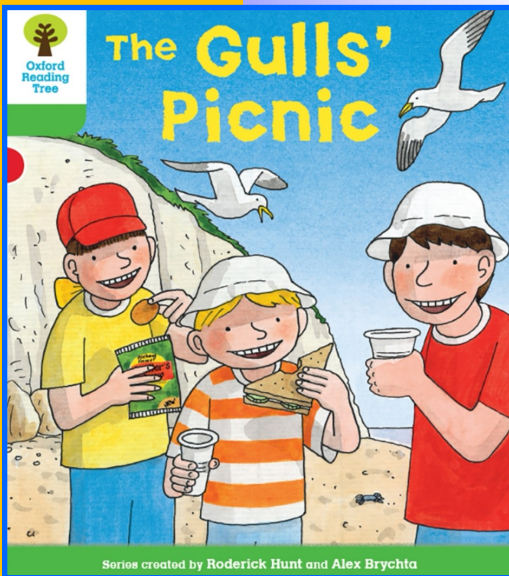


David has worked really hard on his writing.

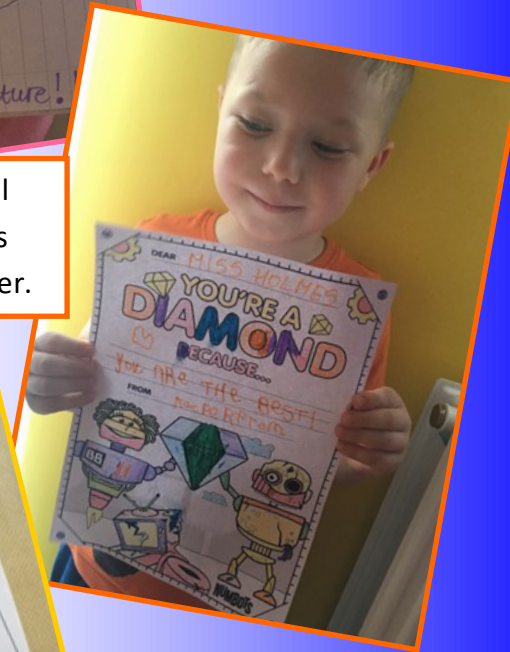

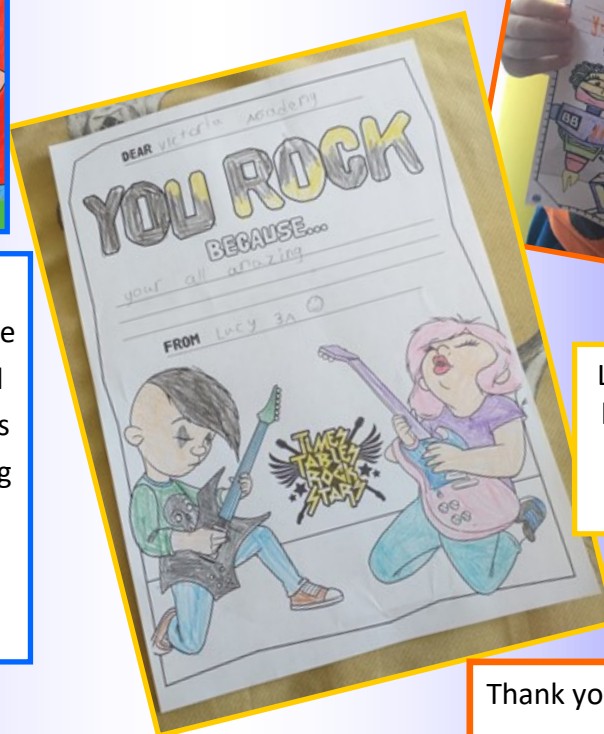

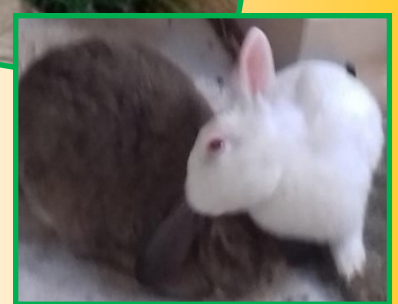
Hugo's drawings of fruit and veg!
