Mrs Little and her family have been watching the progress of this beautiful peony, from bud to full bloom.

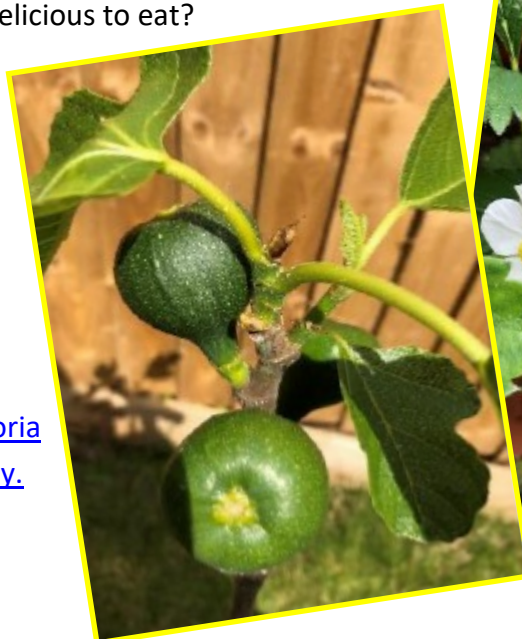
How glorious and what a fabulous colour!

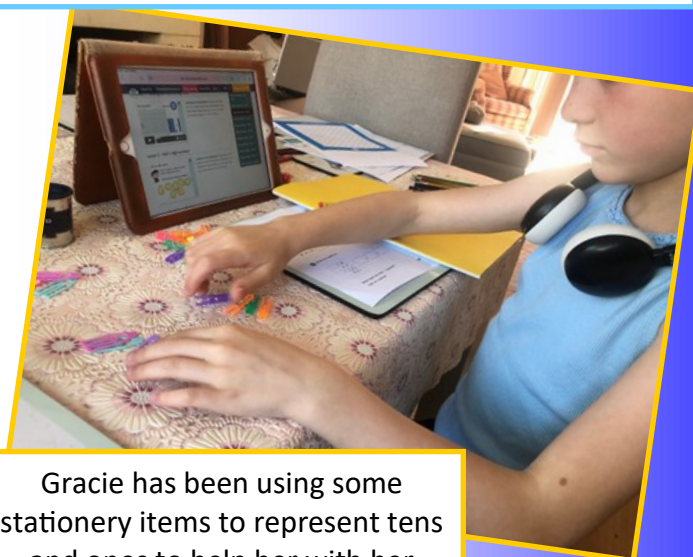


What an amazing challenge! Good luck to the Little family. Let us know how you get on!

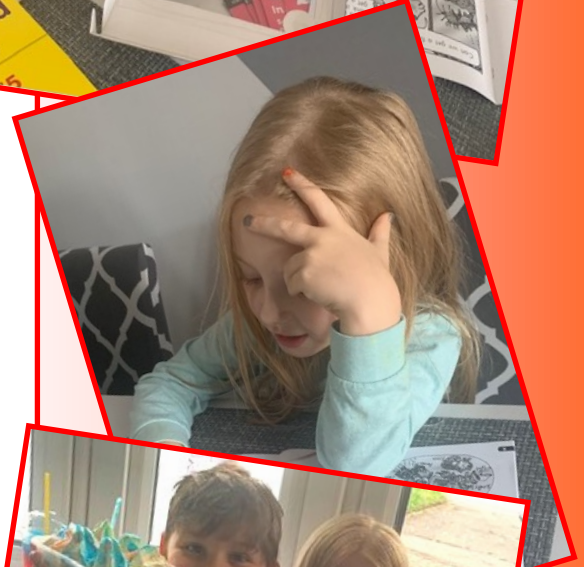
I watch BBC bitesize everyday and I love it. I have just started reading Slime by David Walliams and even though I'm only on chapter 6 I think it's the best book I have read.

We hope you are all keeping safe and well

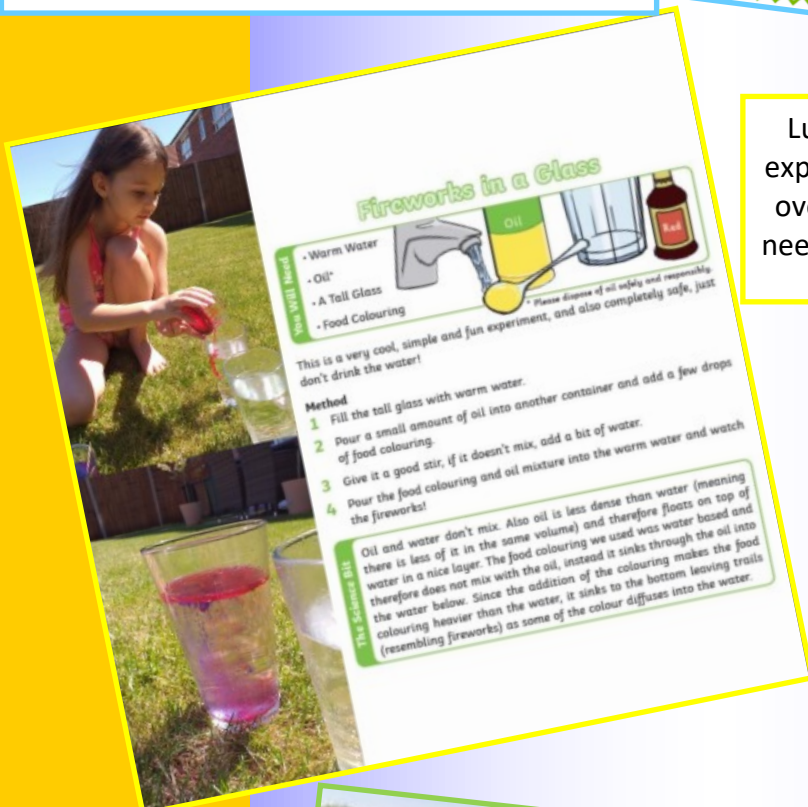
Mia Vincent wanted me to send this to you so that you can see that she is trying very hard to keep up with her maths. She has answered 1500 maths questions and is very proud of herself.

She said although she doesn't always log on to the apps that the school provide, she is trying to use her IXL as much as she can.

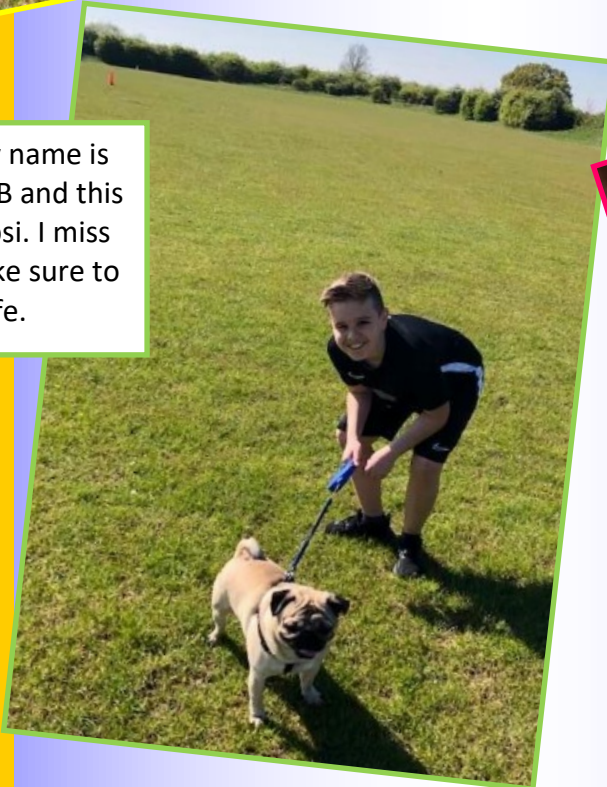
She misses you all very much as well.

Hello guys, my name is Georgi. I'm in 6B and this is my dog Mopsi. I miss you all and make sure to keep safe.

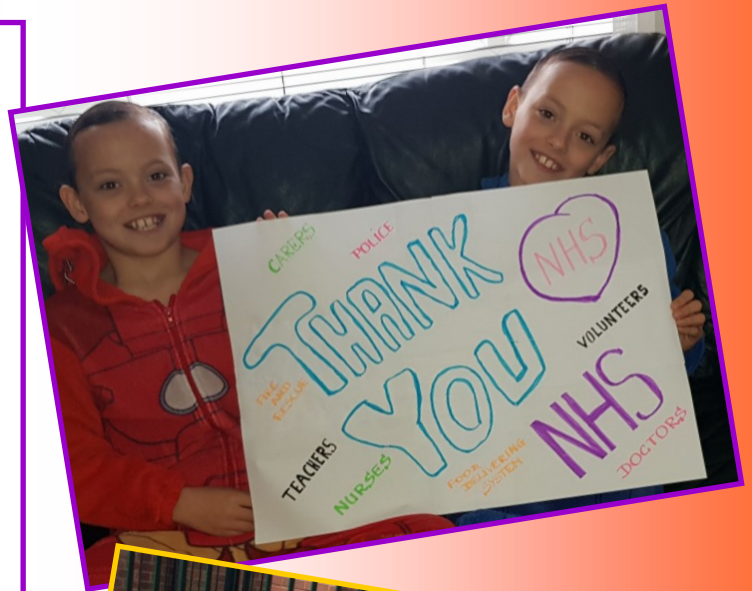


What a beautiful, summery picture Ola from Class 1B has sent in.
