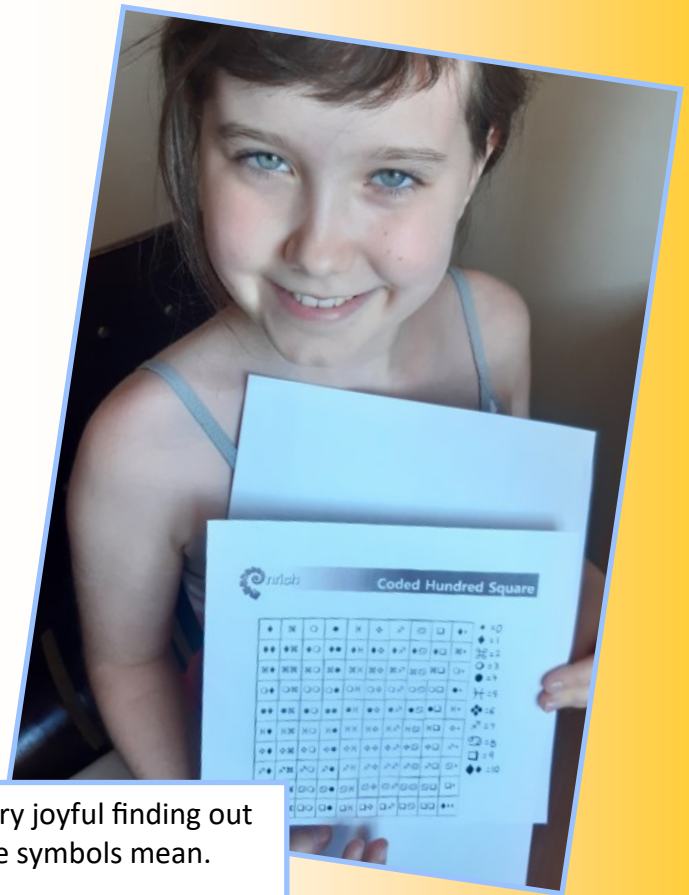
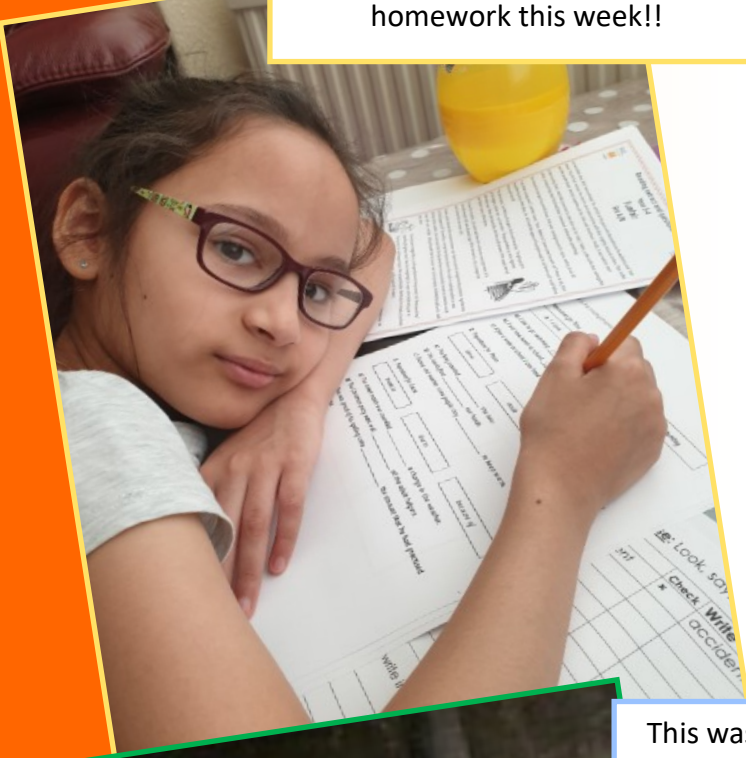
We each chose a minibeast, we then wrote some clues based on its features. Once we completed our clues, we read them out to see if everyone else could guess the correct minibeast.

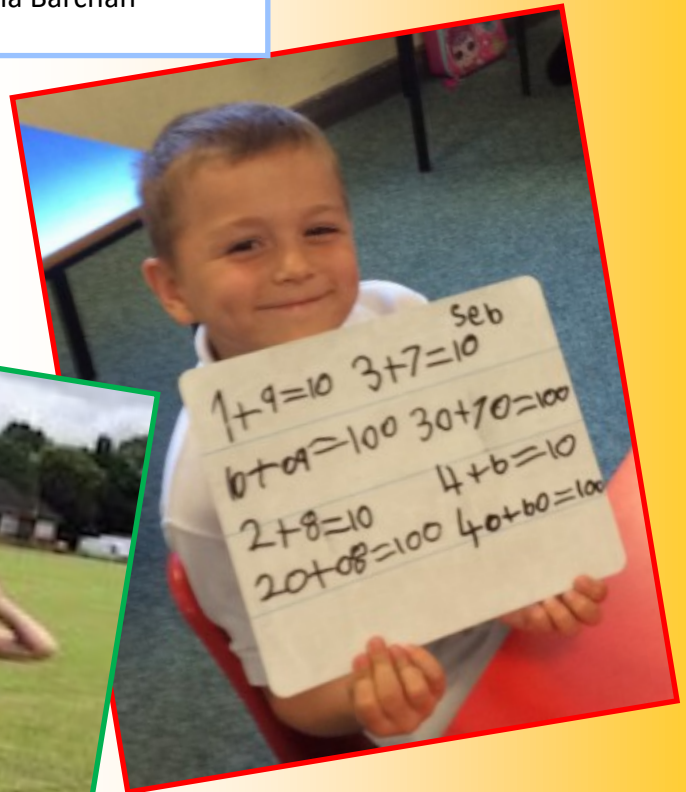
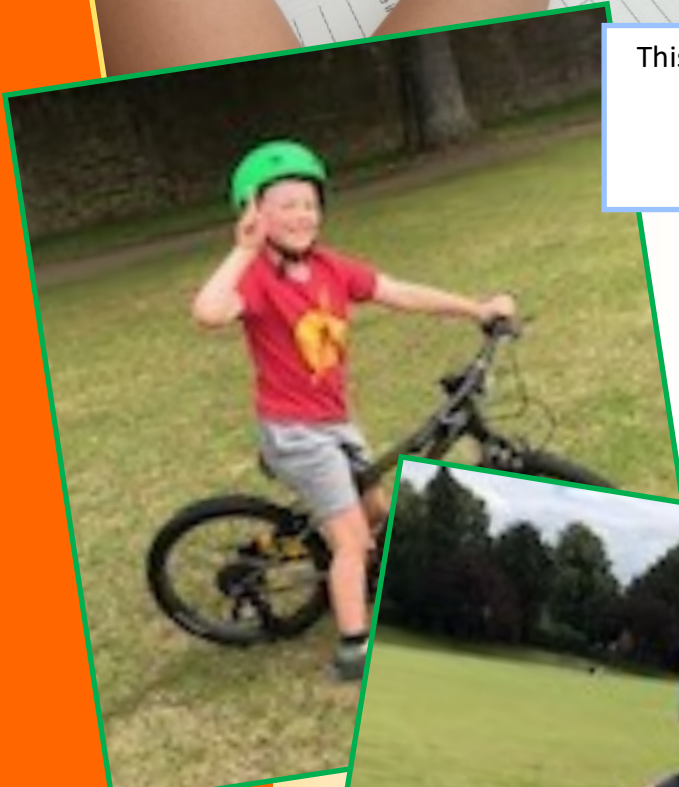
