ATTENDANCE MATTERS

What are the current rules around school absence?

From the beginning of the Autumn term 2020, pupil attendance at school is compulsory, and the usual rules concerning attendance apply. This means that parents have a legal obligation to ensure their child attends school regularly. The school has a responsibility to record the attendance of pupils and follow up on any absence, and sanctions such as fines may be issued if parents fail their obligations. However, pupils will not be counted as absent where they cannot attend school for reasons related to coronavirus.

Can I take my child out of school during term-time for a holiday?

You may not take your child out of school during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances that require you to take this holiday—for example, the funeral of a family member, or illness. If you go abroad, please bear in mind that you may have to quarantine for 14 days before being able to return to school.

Requesting a leave of absence

If you need to request permission for absence, you must do so by making a formal Request for Leave of Absence, a form which is available from the school office. **You must also submit evidence that supports the reasons for the absence no later than 21 days before you plan for your child to be absent from school. It will be for the head teacher to determine how long the child may be away from school.**

What happens if my Request for Leave of Absence is denied?

If your request is denied, you may not take your child out of school. If you choose to do so, your child's absence from school will be marked as 'not authorised'. Where you continue to take your child out of school, or where your child is absent from school for more than the permitted number of days, you may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice by the local authority.

The Fixed Penalty Notice is £60 per parent, per pupil. If you fail to pay the Fixed Penalty Notice within 21 days, this will increase to £120. Where you do not pay within 28 days, you could receive a summons to attend the Magistrates Court.

We hope you all enjoyed watching the pantomime this week!




After School Activity Packs
