Wrap, Splat, Hat

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Schools are responsible for recording attendance, following up absence and reporting children missing education to the local authority.

If you are concerned about punctuality or attendance and would like support, please ask to speak to see one of our Inclusion team or the Attendance Officer.

Medicines

Medicines prescribed by a doctor can be administered at school by a member of staff. The label with the child's name and dosage instructions must be intact and legible. An adult must bring in and collect the medication from the office.

Absence

If your child is not able to attend school, please telephone to let us know by 9.00am each morning of absence.


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ATTENDANCE MATTERS

The world is run by those who turn up.

Attending school every day = 100% attendance

Attending 4½ days a week = 90% attendance = 4 weeks missed per year.



Attending 3½ days each week = 70% attendance = more than a quarter of the school year missed.

An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

Being late for school reduces learning time.

- · If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will miss over three days of learning each year.
- · If your child is 15 minutes late every day they will miss is 2 weeks of learning each year. Make every minute count.

Every School Day Counts

Days off school add up to lost learning. Please don't let your children miss out on the education they deserve.

There are 190 school days in a year and therefore 175 days of holidays and weekends.

Please do not book holidays/family time during school term time – this will not be authorised and you are likely to be fined.


Mrs Hensman was very impressed with Ernest's lovely work.
