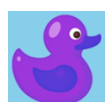

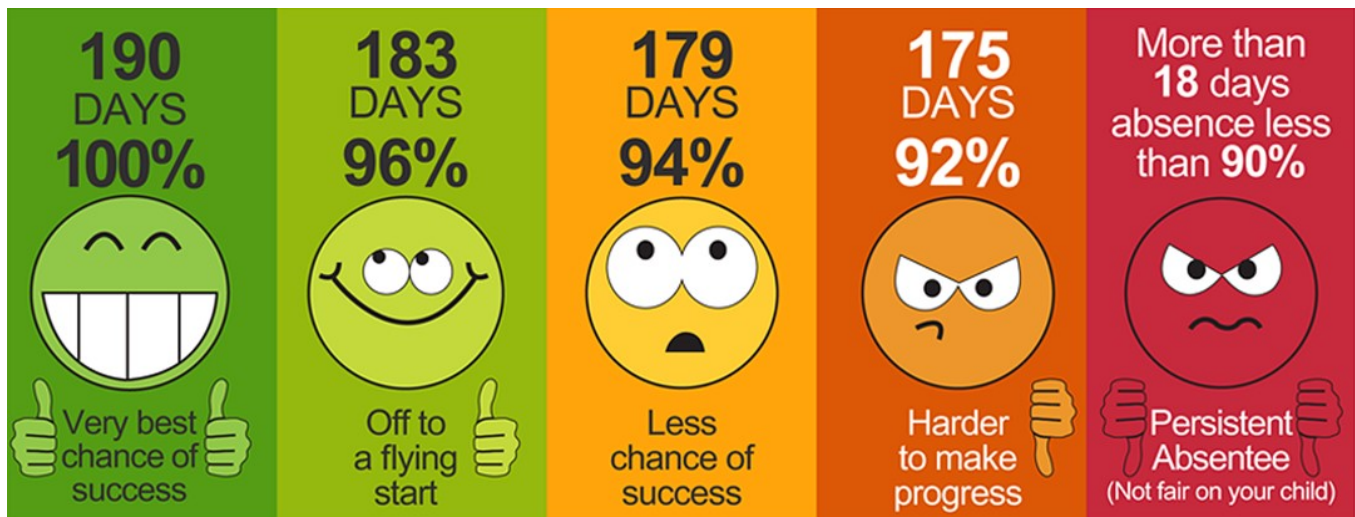

If your child is not able to attend school, please telephone to let us know by 9.00am each morning of absence.

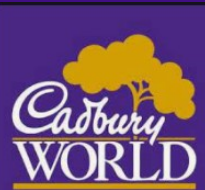

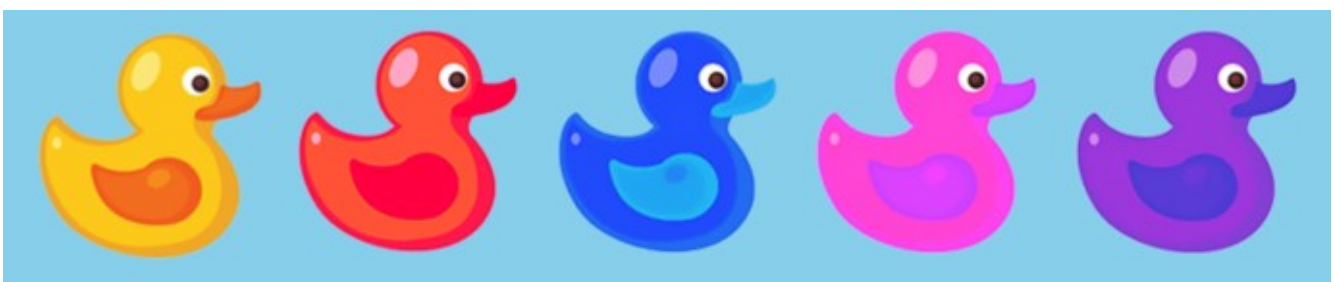

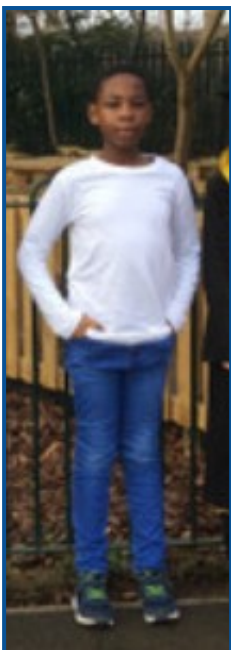
