

## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

### **Term Time Holidays**

Parents/Carers are **not legally** entitled to take their child on holiday during term time. The law does not permit the Principal to authorise term time holidays or extensions to school holidays which run into term time retrospectively. Parents/Carers will be fined by the Local Authority for taking their child on holiday during term time unless exceptional circumstances are approved by the Principal.

### **Fixed Penalty Notices (fines)**

The fixed penalty is £60 per parent, per child if payment is made within 28 days, but this rises to £120 if the payment is made within 42 days.

### **Every School Day Counts**

Days off school add up to lost learning. Please don't let your children miss out on the education they deserve.

### **Absence**

If your child is not able to attend school, please telephone to let us know by 9.00am each morning of absence.

# EXTRA SUPPORT FROM NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE COUNCIL TO HELP FAMILIES MEET THEIR FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS

North Northamptonshire Council is providing families, who are already in receipt of the local School Holidays Meal Support Scheme, a one-off supermarket voucher for each eligible child to the value of £50. This voucher can be redeemed in major supermarkets and can be used to help towards alleviating pressure on critical household budgets.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of North Northamptonshire Council, said: "With inflation at the highest rate for decades and heating prices rocketing, many people are struggling to make ends meet with balancing their household finances. I'm delighted that we're able to offer this support to the most vulnerable in North Northants to help see them through this difficult time.

## Common questions and info...

#### What happens if I don't have a smartphone or internet access?

In those circumstances, your school can provide an alternative, such as a printed version. Please let them know and I'm sure they will be able to help.

### What happens if I have a smartphone, but no data when I am out and about?

In those circumstances, all you need to do is to grab the voucher when you are on wifi and then head out with it already on screen. To be extra certain, take a screen grab of the voucher's contents. It should still scan just fine.

### Can they be spent online?

Most are **not** redeemable for online purchases. You can use your voucher for online shopping at Asda, M&S and Waitrose.

### How often will I get them?

This is decided by the school and they will inform you of this.


### More common questions and info...

#### Where can they be spent?

Most Aldi, Asda, M&S, McColl's, Morrisons, Sainsbury's, Tesco and Waitrose locations are included but there are some restrictions. Mainly petrol stations but please see the terms to the right for an answer specific to each supermarket chain.

From 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 we will be using +Pay on ParentMail – an online payment service which allows you to pay for school items, trips and clubs quickly and easily on your smartphone, tablet or computer.

We will inform you about any items you need to pay through ParentMail, and you will be able to pay electronically, using credit or debit cards as well as PayPal and PayPoint.

If you have an Android or Apple smartphone, we would highly recommend you download the free ParentMail App so that you can make easy, online payments on the go. To do this, simply search for "ParentMail" in your App store.

We are hoping to go completely cashless over the next few weeks so appreciate your support in making payments electronically. However, if you do not wish to make payments online, you can continue to make cash payments.

Please note, your bank statement will display either the school name or ParentMail, dependent on your payment method.
