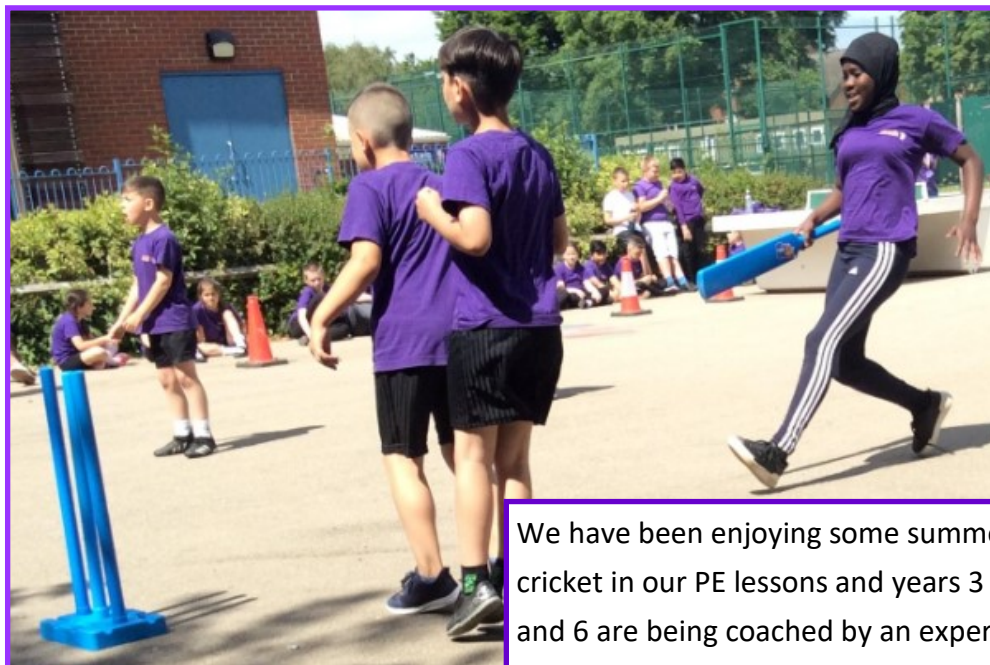

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Please be aware that we will not authorise children to leave school early, or arrive late, because of an appointment for someone else in the family.

Children may be released for their own medical requirements—doctor, optician, dentist or hospital— but we will need to see **proof in writing** of these appointments and receive advanced warning.

Where possible, such appointments must be made out of school hours or during school holidays.

Absence

If your child is not able to attend school, please telephone to let us know by 9.00am each morning of absence.

Your child is taking full advantage of his/her learning.

90 – 95%

Satisfactory, but your child may have to spend time catching up.

85 – 90%

Your child could be in danger of underachieving and will need your support to keep up with his/her work.

80 – 85%

Your child's poor attendance has a significant impact on their learning

Under 80%

Your child is losing a wide and varied education. You are in danger of being prosecuted.

Medicines prescribed by a doctor can be administered at school by a member of staff. The label with the child's name and dosage instructions must be intact and legible. An adult must bring in and collect the medication from the office.




We have seen some very disappointing attendance figures this term, with families taking unauthorised time out of school.

Please be aware that these absences will result in a fixed penalty notice. Good school attendance gives your child enormous benefits and advantages: **they can develop close friendships, make excellent progress in their learning, and not miss out on any educational or social experiences.** It develops good habits for life, and shows you respect and value their education.
