

<b>Here are some of the things you said:</b>	<b>Further Information:</b>
• <i>Nothing/nothing at present/all fine – 18 responses</i>	It is lovely to hear this from parents, but we will continue to look for ways to improve what we do in school for our children.
• <i>More Homework – 7 parents</i>	We completed parent and teacher surveys in the summer term to ask parents their views about home learning. Mrs Embling is reviewing our Home Learning Policy to take account of both parent and teacher views.
• <i>Meet new teachers when they transition from one year to the other on transition days</i>	Teachers are always available at the end of each day to speak to parents if necessary. Some parents/carers did come and introduce themselves to their new teachers at the end of the days. However, we agree, it would be nice to make this more formal to ensure all parents have the opportunity to do this.
• <i>Bullying – 3 parents asked questions around this</i>	We do have a protocol in place for recording bullying incidents. The details of this can be found in our Behaviour Policy and in the HAT Antibullying Policy. We take bullying very seriously and always work with children and their adults to support both victims and perpetrators. Mrs Scargill will share some further information about our approach to bullying with parents/carers in the Autumn term.
• <i>Communication – 3 parents</i>	We communicate in a variety of ways: ParentMail, paper letters, class Dojo, face to face, Facebook & Twitter and our weekly newsletter. We know it can be very frustrating when you don't get the information you need quickly. This year, we have been a bit last minute in letting parents know about some events, we will work to improve on this next year.
• <i>More trips/visits out for the kids.</i>	We absolutely agree! We have worked really hard this year to ensure children have the opportunity to have visits out as well as experience having visitors in. It has been a challenging time to organise events such as this, but as things are now more normal we are working on making this even better. Mr Pearson has created a schedule for visits next year, we have a residential planned for year 4 and will continue to have lots of visitors into school.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Authorized days off, if the child has to go with his parents to another country for family (death of a family member) or religious (marriage, communion) reasons.</i></li> </ul>	<p>When agreeing authorised days off, the Principal has to ensure she follows both the academy and national procedures. Although there are some reasons that authorised leave can be given, this does not include travel time, just the event itself. Mrs Westrep keeps parents/carers updated in the newsletter about all matters attendance related.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Magic a big playing field!! Stop cars parking on pavement within school grounds - the path is already too narrow for amount of people using it at drop off/ pick up times.</i></li> </ul>	<p>A big playing field would be lovely! We liaise with our Community Policing Team regularly about the parking, we know that it is a concern for families. Victoria Primary parent/carer vehicles are not allowed on site. We ask that all parents/carers park legally and considerately at all times.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Breakfast club or more reliable after-school clubs to help working parents</i></li> </ul>	<p>Our after school clubs run on a termly basis, with children being able to attend for a 6-week period. We have a variety of clubs running each day. See the newsletter for the variety of clubs on offer. Cookery, craft, film and free play are always popular. We currently don't have a breakfast club at Victoria.</p> <p>The Victoria Centre collects children from Victoria and walks them down to their centre for after school provision. A number of child minders also drop and collect children from school. We will survey parents in the autumn term to gauge how popular a breakfast club would be. We would need a good group of pupils in order to ensure that we could afford to run a provision such as this.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>When a parent raised an issue the principal should sit down with them to resolve whatever issue is being raised by the parents</i></li> </ul>	<p>Mrs Scargill meets with parents regularly. Sometimes this is informally on the gate, sometimes this is a planned meeting with parents/carers. There is always a member of the senior team and a member of the inclusion team on the gate/in the playground before and after school each day. Mrs Scargill also receives messages on Dojo and via email from parents/carers. She is always willing to meet with parents/carers to discuss their concerns. However, most questions can be answered by the class teacher or office team. This often means you get the answer you need more quickly, as they are the people that know the specific information about year groups and classes.
