What reasons for absence will the school accept?

The Department for Education (DfE) asks schools to identify the reasons a child is absent from school. <u>Authorised</u> absences are for:

- Genuine illness (if you are in any doubt as to whether you should keep your child off contact school and we can advise you.)
- Emergency dental / medical appointments (routine appointments must be made out of school hours)
- 1 Day of religious observance
- Family bereavement.

Exceptional Leave of Absence (only when prior approval has been given by the Principal)

Other absences will be recorded as **unauthorised.**

The school will not authorise absence for

- day trips, birthdays,
- visiting relatives,
- other family members being unwell
- waiting in for deliveries,
- tiredness due to a late night,
- airport drop offs/collections.

Please note any absences occurring either side of school holidays will require medical proof of illness, otherwise the absence may be marked as <u>unauthorised</u>.



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

Last week, we had a great trip with 20 pupils across year 3 and 4 to Wellingborough Library to see the children's author, Joseph Coelho.

Joseph Coelho is an award-winning children's author, performance poet and playwright based in London. He is also the Waterstones Children's Laureate for 2022-2024. His debut poetry collection, Werewolf Club Rules, was the 2015 winner of the CLPE CLiPPA Poetry Award.

We have 2 signed books, to give away as prizes for a poetry competition, inspired by Joseph, that we will be doing alongside the library, in the near future.

To mark World Book Day on Thursday, Camilla, Queen Consort, sat down with Joseph Coelho to discuss their shared love of books and reveal their favourite tales as a child.







BOOK DAY In Assemblies this week we have been learning about the British Value of the Rule of Law and what is means. Children are taught that rules help us know what we should and shouldn't do.
