# Our expectation is that pupils attend school every day.

Regular, uninterrupted attendance secures the best possible learning achievement for all our children and we are committed to working in partnership with families to achieve this.

Schools are expected to monitor all pupils' attendance records closely and to share these with the Local Authority and with the next school when pupils transfer.

#### Persistent absence

The Government considers any pupil whose attendance falls below 90% a "Persistent Absentee". This means they are at serious risk of failing to make progress expected of them and could seriously limit their academic success.

Due to a long period of illness before the end of term, many pupils now fall into this category. If this applies to your family, our Attendance Officer will be in touch with you with a view to achieving a rapid improvement.

Any difficulties in attending school should be discussed as soon as possible with our Attendance Officer or a member of the Inclusion/Pastoral team, who can offer support to help with regular school attendance.

Our policy aims to provide a way for pupils to show that they are proud to belong to our academy community. We believe that a uniform gives a sense of belonging and pride in the academy, whilst ensuring equality amongst pupils. In addition, a smart appearance contributes positively to the pupils' attitude to work and learning; it also influences how the academy is portrayed to the general public and visitors to the academy.

#### The uniform requirements are as follows:

Purple sweatshirt or cardigan with academy logo

**DARK GREY** trousers or shorts, **DARK GREY** skirt or pinafore (*of appropriate length and fit,*) NOT black

Plain white polo shirt or with academy logo

Formal plain, black shoes (well fitted, flat, no additional decoration)

PURPLE gingham (checked) dress, optional in summer

Optional academy coat available - no hoodies

Academy book bag with logo or messenger style bag – no rucksacks

#### P.E. kit

**BLACK** shorts, skort or jogging bottoms

**PURPLE** T-shirt with logo

**Plimsolls** 

An academy PE bag/drawstring bag, to be kept in school

### In addition to appropriate clothing, all pupils are expected to maintain a neat and tidy appearance.

We are aware that many retail outlets identify their products as 'school wear' but, in many cases, the items do not comply with our uniform policy. Trousers and skirts should be **plain dark grey** and of an appropriate length and fit. Leggings, jeggings, jeans or similar items are not acceptable. Shoes must be leather and completely black in colour; no brand names, logos or tags.
