You will be receiving notification of your child's attendance status with their reports.

Please compare this figure to the chart below and be aware of the impact this has on their learning. Poor attendance will also affect your child's future attainment and well-being.

96 – 100%

Your child is taking full advantage of his/her learning.

90 – 95%

Satisfactory, but your child may have to spend time catching up.

85 – 90%

Your child could be in danger of underachieving and will need your support to keep up with his/her work.

80 – 85%

Your child's poor attendance has a significant impact on their learning

Under 80%

Your child is losing a wide and varied education. You are in danger of being prosecuted.

Please be aware that we will not authorise children to leave school early, or arrive late, because of an appointment for someone else in the family.


VICTASTIC CERTIFICATES AWARDED TO.

They even made merchandise to sell: badges, keyrings and bracelets




SUMMER FETE 2022
